

'For what is **your life?**It is **a vapour** that vanishes away...'

Life is but a vapour, a fleeting dash of time between two dates – the dash that lies between the year of our birth and the year of our death.

Many militant atheists who spent their lives actively campaigning against Christianity have had **terrifying deathbed experiences** suggesting that, in their final hours, they sorrowfully realised – with deep regret – that they were wrong. In contrast, many of the world's most renowned Christian preachers, teachers and evangelists have experienced peaceful, hopeful and even **glorious departures from this life**.

Meanwhile many nurses and healthcare professionals who work in end-of-life care, report that atheists and Christians have very different final moments before passing away.

This is worth pondering – indeed **there can be nothing more important to think and pray about.** Each of us has a crucial decision to make. Scripture instructs us to...

Sigmund Freud (*Austrian neurologist and the founder of psychoanalysis*) (1856-1939): "Now it is nothing but torture and makes no sense anymore."

Clarence Darrow (American lawyer & civil rights activist) (1857-1938): "Please intercede for me with the Almighty. During my life I have spoken many times against Christians, and I now realise that I may have been wrong."

Napoleon Bonaparte (French revolutionary General & former King of Italy) (1769-1821): "I die before my time, and my body will be given back to the earth. Such is the fate of him who has been called the great Napoleon. What an abyss between my deep misery and the eternal kingdom of Christ!"

Voltaire (François-Marie Arouet, French Enlightenment writer, philosopher) (1694–1778):

"I am abandoned by God and man! I shall go to hell!"

David Hume (Scottish philosopher) (1711-1776):

"Lam in flames!"

Thomas Paine (Revolutionary and former Deputy of the French National Assembly) (1737-1809): "I would give worlds if I had them, that the Age of Reason had never been published. O Lord, help me! Christ, help me! Stay with me! It is hell to be left alone."

Sir Thomas Scott (English politician) (1535-1594): "Until this moment, I thought there was neither a God nor a hell. Now I know and feel that there are both, and I am doomed to perdition by the just judgment of the Almighty."

Edward Gibbon (English historian and Member of Parliament) (1737-1794): "All is now lost. Finally, irrecoverably lost. All is dark and doubtful."

Robert Ingersoll (*nicknamed "the Great Agnostic"*, *was an American lawyer*, *writer*) (1833–1899): "O God, if there be a God, save my soul, if I have a soul!"

Sir Francis Newport (English politician) (1620–1708): "Oh, that I was to lie upon the fire that never is quenched a thousand years to purchase the favour of God and be united to him again! But it is a fruitless wish. Millions and millions of years will bring me no nearer to the end of my torments than one poor hour. Oh, eternity, eternity! Forever and forever! Oh, the insufferable pangs of hell!"

Joseph Everett (Methodist Episcopal minister) (dates not specified): "GLORY! GLORY! GLORY!" (Repeated for over twenty-five minutes until his passing.)

William Wilberforce (*British politician, philanthropist, and leader of the movement to abolish the slave trade*) (1759-1833): "My affections are so much in heaven that I can leave you all without a regret; yet I do not love you less, but God more."

Martin Luther (German theologian and key figure in the Protestant Reformation) (1483–1546): "Our God is the God from whom cometh salvation. God is the Lord by whom we escape death!"

John Wesley (English cleric and theologian, founder of Methodism) (1703–1791):

"The best of all is, God is with us. Farewell! Farewell!"

D.L. Moody (American evangelist and publisher) (1837-1899): "If God be your partner, make your plans large. If this is death, it is sweet. There is no valley here. God is calling me, and I must go."

The Good News: A Broken Relationship Restored
